Saturday, 7:30 a.m. to 2:45 p.m.

Transfer Station Permit Required:

- Permit is free for SMART customers
- Permit fee is \$50 for non-SMART customers

Antifreeze & waste oil



Batteries (rechargeable & car) Also, take to Interstate All Battery Center, 154 Faunce Corner Rd, North Dartmouth, (508) 991-8019 (fee may apply for rechargeable)

Clothing & shoes Also, if gently used: Gifts to Give, 1 Titleist Drive Acushnet, (508) 717-8715 or if gently used, torn or stained: clothing bin, visit town.dartmouth.ma.us to view a map of locations



Computer monitors & televisions (\$10 each) Also, take to Best Buy: 27 Faunce Corner Rd., Dartmouth, (508) 984-0002 (fees apply)



Corrugated cardboard



Fluorescent lamps, thermostats and other mercury containing devices. Also, take compact fluorescent lamps to Lowe's, 55 Faunce Corner Rd., Dartmouth, (508) 441-5284 or Home Depot, 470 State Road, Dartmouth, (508) 997-9600



Mattresses and box springs (\$35 each) HandUp also provides curbside pickup and drop-off of mattresses and box springs. Visit www.handupmattress.com/curbside-pickup.



Propane tanks (\$5 for empty, \$10 with propane)



Recyclable containers (metal cans, glass food & beverage containers, & plastic bottles, jugs & jars)



Recyclable paper (newspaper, magazines, junk mail, office & school paper, phone books, food boxes, tissue & shoe boxes)



Scrap metal (washer, dryers, air conditioners, & refrigerators; fee may apply)



Styrofoam blocks



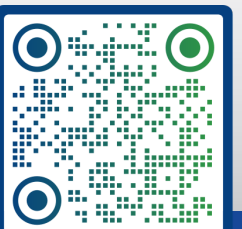
Tires (two tires free for SMART customers, bring punch card) Call local tire recycling companies to ask about dropping off tires. If you have your tires changed, pay the fee to have the old tires recycled.

Set Out for Curbside Collection

Spring 2023 Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Monday & Tuesday Solid Waste Routes

Fridays: April 14, May 5, & May 19

Wednesday & Thursday Solid Waste Routes

Fridays: April 28, May 12, & May 26

Fall 2023 Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Monday & Tuesday Solid Waste Routes

Fridays: October 6, October 27, & November 17

Wednesday & Thursday Solid Waste Routes

October 20, November 3, & December 1

How to Set Out Yard Waste

1. Place grass, leaves and twigs (no larger than 1/4" in diameter) loose in barrels or biodegradable bags.
2. Set at curb by 7:00 a.m.



Drop Off at Water Pollution Facility

[TRANSFER STATION PERMIT REQUIRED]

7:30 a.m. to 3:15 p.m.

Saturday 7:30 a.m. to 2:45 p.m.

Accepted: grass and leaves, small branches, bushes, prunings or general brush.

Maximum size is 6 inches in diameter and 4 feet in length.
No stumps.

Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off (NO LATEX PAINT)

April 29th & September 23rd, 8:30 a.m. to noon

(DARTMOUTH, NEW BEDFORD, & FREETOWN RESIDENTS ONLY, ID REQUIRED)

Sign up is required. Visit gnbrmdistrict.org to select a time slot.

Location: Crapo Hill Landfill, 300 Samuel Barnet Blvd.

Enter through the New Bedford Business Park. One way traffic at event.

No latex paint; dry out and throw away in the regular trash. No waste oil or antifreeze.

Examples of hazardous wastes accepted: oil-based paints, thinners, & gasoline.

Maximum load size is 25 pounds or 25 gallons. Event is for households only.

(ALL ARE WELCOME , NO RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT) Limit of two boxes per person.

Waste Bans

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection bans certain materials from being disposed in landfills including cardboard, paper, bottles, cans, hazardous materials, leaves, grass, brush, tires, mattresses & box springs.



Clothing, footwear, bedding, towels, curtains, fabric & cloth accessories are also banned from the trash. Visit bbbsfoundation.org/schedule-a-pickup, or call or text PICKUP to (508) 466-4590. Take ripped, stained, or gently used items to a clothing bin.

Compost Bins



Around 20% of trash going to the landfill is food. Backyard composting turns fruit, vegetable scraps & yard waste into nutrient-rich soil for your garden.

What Goes In Your Recycling Carts?

Gray Lid Bottles, Cans, Jugs & Jars

1. Empty & rinse containers.
2. Place loose in cart.

Black Lid Paper & Cardboard

1. Flatten boxes.
2. Place loose in cart.
